



Knowledge transfer and exchange

What is it about?

Promoting the transfer of the know how towards developing countries, to speed up innovation, solve problems at local level, and find local, regional and international solution for development issues.

Why an intervention?

Certain development interventions are not sustainable because there is the lack of the transfer of know-how that corresponds to the local context to support the sustainability of the intervention after the intervention exits. In addition cultural differences are not well integrated and understood.

What does it change?

- Acquisition of the relevant know-how and skills to deal with development trends and technology;
- Identification of the right knowledge format that fits well into local context;
- Better understanding of the knowledge management for development's culture both on business case and on community level;
- Implementation of the structured knowledge into local knowledge bases
- Translation of academic knowledge into non-academic knowledge into local context.

How does it work?

- Creation of regional knowledge transfer platforms to analyze and to discuss the culture issues knowledge management for development, and best practices both on business case and on community level;
- Collaboration between business, public officials and communities' leaders on efficient knowledge management for development;
- Engagement of development stakeholder at various development interventions on knowledge for development;
- Organization of development forums based on knowledge transfer, know-hows and its cultural implication.

Who are the beneficiaries?

Development agencies who are willing to get more development impacts or results on the ground as well as the local authorities and regional development organizations who are willing to acquire the know-how that promote their own local sustainability.
